

Friends School of Baltimore Summer at Friends 2021

Community Code of Conduct

In order to maintain an orderly, respectful and secure educational environment for the campers, students, faculty and staff of Friends School, the School has implemented safety protocols, policies and procedures designed to reduce the spread of COVID-19 as the School's campus re-opens for in-person camps during summer 2021 ("Health and Safety Protocols"). Those Safety Protocols can be found here and may be updated as the School continues to evaluate and develop safe practices.

It is imperative that all members of our school community remain committed to the safety policies and procedures to assist us in keeping campers, students, staff, and faculty safe. The School expects families to comply with Safety Protocols and the following requirements for a safe return to camp:

- Follow Federal, State, and Local Orders. All families are expected to adhere to the directives of applicable federal, state, and local government health departments, including the CDC regarding social distancing in public and other measures to reduce the spread of COVID-19.
- Social Distancing. Limit your family's attendance at gatherings, events, and other activities to those
 that can maintain social distancing. To help reduce the risk of COVID-19 exposure at Friends, the School
 expects all families to avoid hosting or attending gatherings, events, and other high-risk activities
 where proper social distancing and mask wearing are not practiced, and attending rec and club
 sporting events and large affairs where social distancing and mask wearing are not practiced.
- **Testing for COVID-19**. You must notify the camp nurse if your child or someone in your household tests positive for COVID-19.
- Stay Home if Sick. Anyone who is sick with a fever of 100 degrees of higher or has any other symptoms of illness will not be allowed to attend on-campus camp.
- Hygiene. Practice and reinforce good hygiene practices at home.
- Stay Home if Exposed. If your child has been exposed (15 minutes or more and less than 6ft from individual) to an individual who has tested positive with COVID-19, you are expected to keep them home from camp for at least 10 days. In addition, the School may require your camper to self-quarantine for at least 10 days if the School believes the camper may have been in contact with someone who is infected with COVID-19.
- Travel. If your child or anyone in the child's household has traveled to a COVID-19 hot spot, as
 designated on the website: www.covidactnow.org, you are required to notify the school and take a
 COVID-19 test upon return to Maryland.

- **Temperature Checking.** The School will be checking temperatures of campers upon arrival each day on campus. If your child presents with a fever of 100 degrees or higher, your child will be sent home.
- Face Masks. Send your child to school with a face mask every day he or she is attending on-campus programs. (Neck gaiters are prohibited.)
 - o Teach your child how to properly use and remove a face mask.
 - o If using fabric masks, ensure that your child's mask is cleaned regularly.
- Medical Forms; Emergency Contacts. Parents must complete and submit all required camper medical forms prior to the first day of camp. Parents must provide at least two (2) emergency contacts who are able to pick up your child from the School within one (1) hour of receiving a call from the School if your child presents with a fever or becomes ill during the camp day.
- **Students' Personal Items.** Limit the items your child brings onto campus each day and reinforce policies around sharing of food, supplies and other items with other-campers.
- **Pick-up and Drop-off.** Parents are expected to wear face masks and remain in their cars during pick-up/drop-off time.
